A lecture was presented on **Women's role in curbing corruption in Shipping** by Capt. Kaustuv Dutta, Warden, Chairman CMMI Kolkata Chapter.

Over the last few decades world has witnessed an exponential increase in corruption in the Shipping industry's almost all segments, Capt. Dutta analyses various angles of women's roles in curbing corruption in Shipping. He said a considerable number of studies have emerged

that described the gender-based behavioral differences between men and women. For example, men are more selfish than women.

Research scholars have concluded that greater participation by women at high ranks in shipping significantly reduces the corruption in the lower level of the organization and this is manifested in a cross-section of countries. This is because women have more helping behaviors than men and are less likely to sacrifice the common interest for their personal gain. This ideology can set robust anti-corruption Shipping institutions across the globe.

mental health issues. Away from home, family, friends, peculiar long working hours without break, and uncertainty of returning home often cause severe fatigue and the absence of family's physical presence can cause a severe psychological impact on their

minds. They are exposed to various stressors in the workplace.

Furthermore, numerous Academic and Business studies have reported on board hazardous work conditions, and the physical and mental health of seafarers and confirm this statement,

Seafarers' work environment, work routine, physical and mental fitness requirements, and the contrasting difference between lifestyles onboard and onshore make them a unique population. The effort to keep a healthy fleet requires a multiple-pronged approach that encourages the seafarer to take charge of his/her health.

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some of which eventually cause deaths or high-level addiction due to clandestine substance use during their tenure on board.

In the past, Insurance Companies, like Steamship Mutual received various claim notifications of accidents and attempted suicides or in some cases, seafarers taking their own lives. Steamship Mutual has stated "There are many causes of these events, including family issues and bullying by respective companies and other seafarers. Whilst we are all encouraged to talk about mental health, it seems that it is still an un-mentionable subject in the Shipping Industry, consequently, the seafarers are missing out on vital support and treatment at the early stages of their illness". BMC Psychology published an article in May 2022 and expressed a similar

line of thoughts as Steamship Mutual and identified 28 socio-demographic and personal characteristics which affect seafarers and cause their mental disorders. **Capt. Dr. Deb Goswami** methodically integrated these socio-demographic characteristics into DSM Manual and explained how the seafarers were affected.
