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Inaugural Session



Italian Marines Involved in the killing of Indian fishermen to be free

talian court has formally dropped the proceedings against two of their marines involved in the killing of fishermen off the Kerala Coast way back in 2012, according to media reports.

This brings to an end a years-long event

The Rome Court judge, while pronouncing the judgment, said that the Court followed an assessment by prosecutors last month that there was not enough evidence for a trial. "This brings to an end a years-long event. In a statement, Italian Defense Minister Lorenzo Guerini welcomed the move.

The Italian court judgment comes months after the case against them was dropped by the Supreme Court of India. The supreme court had ruled that a sum of rs four crores each should be given to the families of the deceased Indian fishermen and the remaining Rs two crores to the owner of the boat. The apex court had dropped the proceedings only after the compensation amount was received from the Italian authorities.

The Italian Marines Salvatore Girone and Massimiliano Latorre shot dead unarmed fishermen off the southern Indian coast in February 2012.

Girone and Latorre were members of Italy's elite San Marco Marine regiment

The two Italian marines had claimed that they mistook the fishermen as sea pirates. The kerala police arrested and charged both with homicide. Girone and Latorre were members of Italy's elite San Marco Marine regiment. Italy argued the marines were in international waters and had fired on the fishing boat because it failed to heed warnings to stay away.

In 2015, Italy took the case to the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague, which ruled that the Marines were entitled to immunity. In 2016, the same tribunal allowed Girone, who had been holed up in the Italian embassy in New Delhi, to return to Italy.

Massimiliano Latorre had already returned home two years earlier for treatment after a stroke. India in April

2021 accepted a compensation offer of Rs 10 crore. The same year the case was quashed in June. The Supreme Court ruled that Rs 4 crore each would be given to the families and the remaining Rs 2 crore to the owner of the boat.

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Hapag-Lloyd achieves extraordinarily strong operating result in 2021



2021 Annual Report with the audited financial figures on 10 March 2022

n the basis of preliminary Jfigures, Hapag-Lloyd's earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortisation (EBITDA) for the 2021 financial year increased to more than USD 12.8 billion (approximately EUR 10.9 billion). Earnings before interest and taxes (EBIT) rose to roughly USD 11.1 billion (approximately EUR 9.4 billion). The main drivers of these positive business developments have been significantly improved freight rates resulting from very strong demand for goods exported from Asia. At the same time, the major disruptions in global supply chains have led to a significant increase in transport expenses.

Revenues increase attributed to a higher average freight rate

Revenues increased roughly USD 26.4 billion **EUR** (approximately billion). This can mainly be attributed to a higher average freight rate of 2,003 USD/ TEU (2020: 1,115 USD/TEU). Transport volumes were roughly on a par with the prior-year level, at 11.9 million TEU (2020: 11.8 million TEU), due to the strained supply chains.

Hapag-Lloyd will publish its 2021 Annual Report with the audited financial figures and an outlook for the current financial year on 10 March 2022.
