25 migrants killed when a boat sinks off the Madagascar coast

At least 25 migrants died when their boat sank off the coast of Madagascar over the weekend, the island nation's maritime authorities said.

"Forty-seven people had clandestinely taken a boat headed to the French territory of Mayotte, but that sank," the Madagascar

maritime authority said in a statement on March 13th.

"Twenty-three of the passengers were saved. Twenty-two bodies were found," it said, adding that the accident occurred on March 11th and that search-and-rescue operations were continuing.

Many migrants try each year to reach the French territory of Mayotte,

which lies north of Madagascar in the Indian Ocean.

In 2021, more than 6,500 people were detained trying to enter the territory clandestinely, according to French authorities.

Australia to receive Nuclear powered submarines from United States



Australia is all set to receive the first batch of US manufactured Nuclear power attack submarines

Australia is all set to receive the first batch of US manufactured Nuclear power attack submarines to provide a leadership role in the Indo Pacific region in a bid to contain the growing influence of China

US President Joe Biden is set to meet with two of America's closest allies to announce that Australia will purchase US-submarines to modernize its fleet, amid growing concerns about China's

influence in the Indo-Pacific region. Biden is traveling San Diego in the US West coast on March 13th, where he will meet Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak for talks on the nuclear partnership known by the acronym AUKUS.

The partnership, announced in 2021, paved the way for Australia's access to nuclear-powered submarines, which are stealthier and more capable than conventionally powered boats, as a

counterweight to China's military buildup. San Diego is Biden's first stop on a three-day trip to California and Nevada. He will discuss gun violence prevention in the community of Monterey Park, California, and his plans to lower prescription drug costs in Las Vegas.

A future generation of submarines will be built in the UK and Australia with US technology and support. The initial plans call for all of the Australian subs to be constructed in Adelaide, Australia. US would also step up its port visits in Australia to provide the country with more familiarity with nuclear-powered technology before it has such subs of its own.

Meanwhile, **China has argued that the AUKUS deal is in violation of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty,** arguing that the transfer of nuclear weapons materials from a nuclear-weapon state to a non-nuclear-weapon state is a "blatant" violation of the spirit of the pact. "
