

MARINE NEWS Mariners use torch to free crewmates from sinking tugboat

he Coast Guard assisted a sinking tugboat taking on water in Sabine Pass, Texas, Friday 31 March.

Coast Guard Sector Houston Galveston center command

watchstanders notification at 5:38 a.m. that the crew of the Sea Cypress, a 71-foot tug, hailed mayday on VHF-FM channel 13 and reported that the vessel was capsizing while moored near the mouth of the Sabine Pass channel.

received

urgent marine information broadcast and directed the launch of a 45-foot Response Boat-Medium crew from Coast Guard Station Sabine.

An on-scene Sabine **Pilot** boat operator that reported two of the Sea Cypress crew used a handheld torch to cut a hole in the bulkhead and

in the partially submerged vessel's galley. The Coast Guard boat crew arrived on scene, took aboard the four tugboat crewmen and brought them ashore to Station Sabine.

Jefferson County EMS personnel assessed the four mariners and transported them to Southeast

Watchstanders issued an free two crewmen trapped Texas Medical Center in Port Arthur, Texas, in stable condition.

> "We are glad that the tugboat crew was able to think outside the box and that we were able to quickly get all four of them to safety," said Coast Guard Lt. Cmdr. Ian Murray, search and rescue mission coordinator, Sector Houston-Galveston.

nature in the conditions of employment, except where the employment of women in such work is prohibited or restricted by or under any law for the time being in force.

To enhance the employability of female workers, the Government is providing training to them through a network of Women Industrial **Training institutes, National Vocational Training Institutes and Regional Vocational Training Institutes.**

Further, employment generation coupled with improving employability is the priority of the Government. Accordingly, the Government of India has taken various steps for generating employment in the country.
