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

FFFAI Chairman Shankar Shinde appointed on Board of Governing **Council of Logistics Skill Council (LSC)**



Shankar Shinde. Chairman, of the Federation of Freight Forwarders Associations in India (FFFAI) recently appointed as a member of the Board of Governing Council of the Logistics Skill Council.

This is a very significant move by the LSC being FFFAI the umbrella organization of Customs Brokers/Freight Forwarders associations across India representing more than 6500 members. This is also very significant considering the fact that FFFAI through its training arm Indian Institute of Freight Forwarders (IIFF) is skilling logistics professionals and freshers aspiring to enter into this highly potential sector in terms of career opportunities.

Logistics Sector Skill Council, (LSC) is a non-profit organization set up by the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and Confederation of

Indian Industries (CII) with the aim to ensure skill-trained Human Resources at entry level and upskill the logistics workforce. LSC works with stakeholders, including industry players, government agencies, training providers, and academic institutions, to identify the skill gaps in the logistics sector and design training programs to address those gaps.

LSC encompassing is institutional mechanisms for ensuring that the share of skilled trained manpower in the Logistics sector is increased rapidly. Setting up of Centres of Excellence, the introduction of Apprenticeships in logistics, and revamping the Course curricula in academia will propel the pace of skill development in the sector. LSC is gearing up all its logistics sub-sectors to spread awareness in such a way as to make it an aspirational sector, for both men and women.

It is expected Mr. Shankar Shinde's appointment to the Board of Governing Council would further strengthen LSC's reach to the ground level of the end-toend logistics industry segment PAN India. Commenting on his appointment and the importance of LSC for the Indian logistics industry to facilitate the exportimport trade

Mr. Shinde said, "FFFAI is a larger platform covering every aspect of Logistics. This is a good opportunity to understand and build the GAP between Academician and Practitioners to conceptualize a curriculum to create the talent pool as per industry requirements. The LSC team experts will enhance the education system to

professionalize the Logistics sector for the next generation to adopt a career in Logistics as a first choice rather than optional."

The Members of the Governing Council are representatives of the 12 Sub Sectors that LSC represents namely: Warehousing (including tertiary packaging), Land Transportation (including Commercial Vehicle Drivers for Cargo), Cold Chain Solutions, Courier and Express Industry, E-Commerce, Port Terminals, Inland Container Depots, and Container Freight, Air Cargo Handling (other than Tarmac side operations), Freight Forwarding and Customs, Marine Services, Shipping and Inland Waterways, Supply Chain Solutions, Liquid Logistics, and Rail Logistics.

Is owning a smartphone a measure of our life satisfaction? Not really, but ten years

ago, things were different.

Technology is like a doubleedged sword. Using social media is a risk factor for mental health. However, during the pandemic, social media enable us to stay in touch with family and friends, get mental support, and feel that we belong to a larger community.

If we look at the top

countries in terms of a high level of happiness, they all have efficient education **Economic** systems. prosperity guarantees that the majority of residents have a fast Internet connection and access to new technologies. There is a vicious circle of factors that affect happiness, and technology is just one of many links in this chain. Much depends not only on health literacy but also on how new technologies used to achieve individual goals. Thanks to computers, we gained more possibilities. Settling many matters that used to be complicated has become simpler, which means that we have more control over our lives and a weaker sense of being dependent on external factors. Thanks computerization, have discovered new ways of spending free time cherished during successive lockdowns.
