advancing 'Nari Shakti' initiative across the sector through various activities." the said minister.

"To increase the number of women in sectors including maritime, is one of the highest priorities of the government. We are committed to support the United nation's 2030 agenda for Sustainable **Development** including goal to achieve gender equality and empowerment of all women." He added.

Union Minister of State for Ports Shipping and Waterways Shripad Naik applauded the achievements of the women honored at the event and emphasized the theme's relevance in promoting collaboration and networking for gender equality in the maritime sector. Radhika Menon during a successful and courageous rescue operation which she led from the front rescuing seven fishermen in 2015as the inspiration for all aspirant young girls.

He informed that The Maritime India Vision Document 2030 envisaged the launch of a 'Women seafarer' program including encouragement to undertake onshore jobs, awareness and marketing

campaigns, incentivizing shipping companies, and leveraging scholarships improve women's participation.
