added that the full potential of the maritime sector may be utilized as we have become more focused on continental development, forgetting that continental development and maritime development are mutually complimentary.

The President said that we will have to overcome several challenges as India does not figure in the top 20 nations when it comes to annual port calls. The majority of our fishing fleet is yet to be mechanized. Hence, the Sagarmala programme is a significant move away from "port development" to "port-led development" with five pillars of port modernization, port connectivity, port-led industrialization, coastal community development and coastal shipping or inland water transportation. She briefed that the third edition of Global Maritime India Summit attracted Rs. 10 Lakh Crores of investment which will help in achieving 'Amrit Kaal Vision 2047'.

Indicating the recent developments, the President briefed about Chandrayaan-3 and the preparation for 'Samudrayaan Mission' and indicated the challenges of climate catastrophe which include rising temperatures and sea levels.

At last, addressing the Cadets, the President stressed on the professional as well as ecological obligation of a student by inculcating sustainable and efficient maritime activities. Praising the IMU, the President stated that despite being one of the youngest Central Universities, IMU has proved its mettle and it has the capacity to become the lighthouse to the maritime sector. By saying this, the President appealed to the successful Cadets to shoulder the higher responsibility than similar age compatriots of other

professions by possessing leadership qualities and displaying special qualities to cope with the extreme demands of the profession.

Lastly, She congratulated the degree recipients and medal winners and extended her best wishes by blessing them to gain the strength to weather the storms that life throws in their path.

Sri Lanka gives 48 hours to Chinese Naval vessel to complete the work




