


Ideas for Global peace through a new book on the Indian Ocean Author Dr. (Capt.) Vivek Jain

It is the most important ocean in the world -33% of the global population along with 50-60% of the world's maritime trade transits through it. In addition, globally around 60% oil, 26% of gas reserves along with pristine beaches are located here. To comprehend the interdisciplinary issues, the editor embarked on a voyage to discover, persuade, and collaborate with

exceptionally brilliant, influential and with relevant experience experts from prominent littoral countries – India, Indonesia, Iran, South Africa, Malaysia, and Singapore to expound the above subject areas. In addition, the geo-political conflicts/hostilities & trade wars are on the rise; war is inevitable **but not imminent.** War will originate in different oceans and seas but will end up impacting its littoral countries. Accordingly, these countries must comprehend the interdisciplinary issues and the special role of the Indian Ocean to prevent the all encompassing



wars/hostilities from widening at a global level and thereafter must flesh out plans to shield themselves. They must also understand its role for global peace by comprehending the above interdisciplinary issues.

The above role of the Indian Ocean for **global peace** can only be achieved by maritime partnerships between littoral countries, and their avoiding impulses to invite outside power(s) to balance each other's power. However, maritime partnerships are easier said than done. In any event, at least maritime partnership between major littoral powers – India and Indonesia are critical to shield the region from geopolitical fires and storms. Further, this maritime partnership tactic of embracing carrot and stick approach will eventually persuade global powers from outside the Indian Ocean region to improve their conduct for achieving global peace.

The editor has dedicated the book to his father without whose pep talk 32 years previously this book would not have been possible. He is also grateful to Mr. Ashok Advani for his support and for ensuring collaboration with one of the top maritime publications, Sagar Sandesh to promote this book.
