NUSI initiative for Seafarer to receive priority booking in Indian Railway



Tational Union of Seafarers of India (NUSI) announced that the long pending demandwith the Government of India (GOI) of getting priority in railway travel for all ranks of seafarers is being discussed by the GOI through the Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Shipping and the Ministry of Railways. Shri Bhagat Singh Koshyari, Hon'ble Governor of Maharashtra had personally taken up the NUSI demand with the Government of India.

The necessary instructions have now been issued by the Government of India, Ministry of Railways – Railway Board vide No. 2021/TG-I/20/P/15 dated 29th April 2022 to Principal Chief Commercial Managers of All Zonal Railways. The instructions are to consider providing confirmed accommodation by giving due priority as per guidelines out of Emergency Quota for any request received from Merchant Navy seafarers going to join a ship or coming down from the ship.

Mr. Abdulgani Serang, General Secretary NUSI expressed his joy and said "This is a great victory for all ranks of seafarers as the Government of India has acknowledged the important role of merchant navy seafarers in facilitating their travel. NUSI and all ranks of seafarers thank Shri Bhagat Singh Koshyari, Hon'ble Governor of Maharashtra, Shri Sarbananda Sonowal, Hon'ble Cabinet Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, and Ayush & Government of India".
